About the Opportunity

The Clinical Psychologist role is to identify, assess, treat, and provide counselling to referred clients experiencing social problems, emotional problems, psychological problems and / or disruptions to their psychological and emotional wellbeing.

Key Selection Criteria

The prospective Koori Kids Clinical Psychologist will ideally:

- Hold a post-graduate degree in Clinical Psychology and current registration as a psychologist with the Psychology Board of Australia.
- Demonstrate an understanding of and sensitivity to Aboriginal cultural values and approaches to mental health and community conceptualisations of emotional and psychological wellbeing.
- Have high level of interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to effectively engage with Aboriginal children, young people, their carers, extended family members, and involved professionals.
- Have a good understanding of child development.
- Have a broad range of experience working as a psychologist with children, adolescents, and families.
- Hold well-developed skills in the theory and application of a range of counselling and therapy approaches to support children, adolescents, and their carers. This includes an understanding of attachment theory and trauma-informed therapeutic modalities.
- Be experienced in undertaking psychological assessments and producing psychological reports in a timely manner.
- Be able to work under pressure and develop creative and flexible solutions to complex problems.
- Demonstrate familiarity with the relevant legislation including the Children, Youth and Families Must have had a Covid-19 Vaccination Booster (3rd dose) prior to commencement
