- Experience in planning and facilitating evidence based/informed therapeutic individual and groups programs.
- A demonstrated experience and skills in mental health and wellbeing issues including substance misuse
- Capacity to analyse complex issues, including the impact of violence and trauma, safety and risk, provide therapeutic interventions for women and children and assist them to achieve goals. Excellent written and verbal communication skills and listening skills
- Good computer skills and an understanding of data collection
- The demonstrated ability to work effectively as part of a multi skilled team.
