In addition to a clinical caseload, the Senior AOD Counsellor provides secondary consultation, mentoring, and case management support to the AOD team. The position contributes to program development, quality improvement, and sector advocacy, ensuring the AOD program remains responsive, effective, and aligned with best practice.

Key responsibilities

- Deliver strength-based, evidence-informed AOD interventions
- Provide clinical support to staff and promote reflective practice
- Manage dual diagnosis, forensic, and high-risk cases
- Maintain strong referral networks and represent VAHS in external forums
- Drive program development, quality improvement, and client outcome monitoring
- Ensure culturally safe engagement with families, Elders, and Community
- Maintain compliance with clinical governance, reporting, and accreditation
- Foster a collaborative, professional, and culturally respectful team environment
